Lancair International Inc. of Redmond, Oregon, announced its Evolution Turbine serial number 0001 on a sales tour in North East Georgia today experienced a landing gear mishap, gear-up landing, after executing a go-around due to traffic congestion at the uncontrolled airport KWDR. Lancair company pilot Bob Jeffrey was at the controls at the time of the mishap which resulted in minor composite damage to the rudder and tail cone only. True to the nature of high strength composites the damage is expected to be fully repaired in 3-5 days.

The Lancair International Support Team is responding with all required materials, parts and technician assistance needed to get the Evolution airborne. The Evolution will resume its highly successful demonstration tour ending with its appearance at the Airventure Oshkosh air show in late July. At Oshkosh it will be joined by its sister aircraft the Evolution Lycoming IE2 Piston which will be making its first public debut.
